HOW IT WORKS



HARMONIZED COMMODITY DESCRIPTION & CODING SYSTEM

Otherwise referred to as the Harmonized Tariff

System of the United States (HTSUS) in the U.S.

and the Harmonized System (HS) in Canada,

this system is used in conjunction with the

General Rules of Interpretation to determine tariff

classification. This system consists of 99 chapters

and can be used to classify any product.

Before getting started, make sure you have all of the following product information available:

- All the materials incorporated in your product
- Every function of your product
- Your product's intended purpose
- Understand the notes in the HTSUS / HS and how they may apply to your product

to request a **Binding Ruling**.

Qualified professionals who can help classify your products may include:

- Licensed Customs Brokers
- Customs Attorneys

A **Binding Ruling** is the definitive assessment of what your product should be classified as.
